# About us



The Little Stars Foundation emerged from a profound desire to empower and uplift children and young people living in foster, kinship, and residential (out-of-home) care throughout Queensland.

The foundation has a solid history of developing and running early intervention programs for children and young people living in outof-home care. Starting with Little Stars Camps, we supported children in out-of-home care and provided a unique opportunity to cultivate optimism and resilience through the pillars of community, education, and fun. We provided camp experiences to hundreds of children. Through the camps, we recognised a crucial gap in learning support for children and young people living in outof-home care, which often begins at a young age and persists throughout their lives, which moved us to act. We believe that learning support is the key to changing outcomes for children and young people in out-of-home care.

Through extensive research, the Little Stars Learners Program was born, and the foundation has provided over \$1 million worth of learning support scholarships to children living in foster, kinship and residential care in South-East Queensland.

# Why support us

In Queensland, the plight of children who have experienced complex childhood trauma is a stark reality.

This number continues to swell, and as the cost of living rises, Queensland's children and young people are at an increasing risk of family violence, homelessness, and deteriorating mental health.

Over 11,500 children and young people are living in foster, kinship and residential care in Queensland. Many of these kids have suffered from years of horrifying abuse and neglect. Once placed in foster or residential care, their journey has only just begun. Issues such as placement instability, cognitive, social and emotional impacts of trauma, school moves and inherent issues with the child protection legislation and systems mean that children often suffer significant secondary trauma once they are in the child protection system as a result of systemic failures and legislation which is not child focused.

These impacts of the primary and secondary trauma of being a child in the 'system' often present as 'behavioural issues' leading to a higher incidence of suspension, exclusions or reduced hours at school, all of which compound the child's ability to engage, learn and have a positive educational experience, increasing the risk for disengagement. This educational gap increases as the child gets older and leads to adverse life outcomes including engagement with the youth justice system, poor mental and physical health, joblessness and a perpetuation of the cycle of abuse for offspring.

It does not have to be like this. Early intervention and support are critical and improving our child protection systems and how we support our youth is without question one of the most important things we can do as a society, not only for these children and young people but for the community as a whole.



# She now actively asks questions in class...

Prior to getting the individualised learning support, the children were struggling to keep up with their peers in the classroom and socially in the playground. J has been diagnosed with a receptive language disorder which means she often doesn't understand information that is delivered verbally, and because of her low selfconfidence, she never asked for clarification and so sat in class feeling overwhelmed.

Since Little Stars has provided this support, her teacher told me at the last parentteacher interview that J is now actively asking questions and seeking clarification in class. This means she is not only understanding more of the classroom content but also gaining confidence.




# Social Return on Investment Evaluation // Lumenia
